Kalasha community and Nuristani communities are directly involved in the practice of the element and is an integral part of their culture. The Gujjur community, being exclusively shepherds are involved in taking animals up to pastures and returning them to their owners for a contract.

1.4 Physical location(s), distribution, and frequency of enactment of the element

Physical Location:- High pastures (hotalaistahn) and lower pastures (past istahn) across the three Kalasha valleys. E.g. UstuiUchara (low), Chet Gah (high), and taraniek are pastures of Chatguru and Kalashagrom villages of the Rumbur valley.

Frequency:- Once a year around late May –June animals are taken up to the high pastures and then return around the 20th of October to lower pastures, followed by a return to their respective villages.

1.5 Short description of the element (preferably no more than 200 words)

High and low pastures are considered *Onjesta*(pure) as per the Kalasha religion, normally associated with males. Young to middle-aged male members of the family are handed the responsibility of taking their livestock (goats, sheeps, and cows) to the high pastures around late May or June depending exactly on the weather. Whilst at high pastures, the shepherds stay in traditional stone and wood built huts known as *Donkur*; the animals stay in a hut known as *Istahn*. A typical morning at the high pasture involves the walmoch taking out the livestock from the istahn, milking them, and then leaving them to graze freely in the pastures. The younger animals are left to graze close to the shepherd huts. In order to sustain themselves, the shepherds cook traditional foods such as *Amishtonu*(a mixture of clarified butter and a cheese known as *Sachon*—made from boiling butter milk), *Gum' au* (wheat pancakes), and *Jawari' au* (corn bread).

Shepherds are renowned for flute playing (ishpoininat) and a popular tune played at the pastures is called 'O dari o'. If the time allows, they hunt Ram Chakor (ChukarPartride), *Bishun*, Ibex, and Marco-Polo sheep. After staying in the high pastures for a period of approximately five months, the walmoch return to the lower pastures at the start of October. They stay in the lower pastures for a period of approximately twenty days and then return back to their villages. The exact time of returning to the villages depends on the weather conditions, and some may return around Mid-November.

At times shepherds (walmoch) from the Gujjur as well as Kalasha community are hired to take care of livestock of others. Under these circumstances, Walmoch are currently paid a salary of approximately seven thousand rupees a month to undertake this task. A parallel mode of payment is a contract lasting three years. Under the contract the walmoch are not paid a monthly salary, instead they have the right to take ownership of the livestock born in the third year of their contract.

Due to transhumance being a main source of livelihood in the valleys, the wider Kalashacommunity are integral stakeholders and facilitate its practice.

3.1 Threats (if any) to the continued transmission of the element within the relevant community (ies)

Security Threats: - Recently two shepherds were murdered at the Bahola'ret pasture used by inhabitants of the Bumburet valley on the 29th of July around 5 Am. Furthermore, approximately three thousand sheep and goats were stolen from the pastures of the Birir valley, by militants crossing the Durand line. This has resulted in the community living in constant state of fear

3.2 Threats to any tangible elements and resources (if any) associated with the element

An intricate balance is to be kept between the number of animals travelling to the pastures and the available food resources. Increased deforestation starting from the lower villages and gradually moving up towards the pastures has resulted in a shortage of fodder for livestock.

3.3 Safeguarding or other measures in place (if any) to address any of these threats and encourage future enactment and transmission of the element

Although not currently implemented, it is being discussed that some pastures be closed for a season on a rotational basis to increase the amount of grazing grass available for livestock.

Communal support is countering security threats.

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3.4 Viability of the element

3.4.1 Does the element require urgent safeguarding

Due to the current security issues the element may be considered for Urgent Safeguarding to increase its enactment especially among the younger generation.

3.4.2 Is the element a viable representative of the ICH of the community(ies)

Being an integral part of the subsistence economy and its inherent connection to the Kalasha socio-cultural and religious ethos, the element is a viable representative of the ICH of the community

3.4.3 Any safeguarding/innovation measures taken for enhancing viability

Due to increased deforestation community members have initiated talks on using pastures on a rotational basis to maintain the intricate balance between the number of livestock and the available fodder in high pastures. Security threats are being addressed by the community through a formation of communal groups who have volunteered to guard the pastures and the livestock present there during the summer months.
